- Change agents

















# Regional Actions- Past and Current

- Regional CDM Strategy 2014-2024
  - Pillar 2: Knowledge management and Learning
  - Education is a priority sector
  - Education Sector Sub-Committee (DRM)
- School Disaster Management
  - Model Safe School Programme (MSSP) for the Caribbean
  - School disaster plans, drills
  - School safety training (OFDA)

- Resilience Education
  - Tsunami Teacher resources
  - DRR Education Toolkit
  - Update Guidelines for Child friendly DRM (UNICEF-CDEMA)
- Safe learning facilities
  - Roll-out MSSP in countries-UNISDR-CDEMA
  - Maintenance as Mitigation
  - Living Schools project























### **National Actions to Date**

#### Safe Learning Facilities

- Policies on emergency and disaster management in schools, school safety, use of schools as shelters
- Hazard assessments

#### **School DM**

- School Emergency Planning, testing and training (USAID OFDA)
- Safe School Safety, Child-friendly programmes

#### **Resilience Education**

- Curriculum reform/integration of DRR
- DRR/CCA Public Awareness & Education (e.g. Grenada CDM Champions, Dominica CERT Camps, VI School)

























## **Some Important Observations**

- Demonstrated history of investing in safe learning environments
- Past and present actions at both national and regional level map to the CSS framework
- Shift towards more comprehensive approaches and robust enabling environment
- A lot of technical resources available
- Limited financial support
