CHALLENGES

1. Country Document = Risk Profile.
2. Few stakeholders participating: unclear ownership
3. Risk scenarios require national experts with external technical help. Include this chapter in the next Country Profile.
4. Implement a more participative process at a national level but also district and community levels.

NATIONAL PRIORITIES

- Strengthen key institutional actors response capacities.
- Support DEM in the implementation of their GIS department.
- Complete country's DRR 3 year plan 2012-2015.
