Key achievements

Local disaster management

61 Committees are currently working in the Martissant and La Gonâve (2 CCPC, 12 CLPC, 3 sub-committees and 44 EIC)

3 contingency plans (draft)

Institutional linkages and advocacy:

National Forum on Disaster Risk Management and EPR

Mainstreaming of DRR into CWW sectoral program

Education and People Sensitization Technical committee (CTESP)

Information, education and communication

9 Community forums held, 50 schools sensitized and competition (sport games, etc...) in DRR , 7 events awareness like IDDRR, etc..., 2 VCA (training, field survey, maps), 1 PGIS is on-going, EWS on-going.



Key achievements

- Small scale infrastructure and services:

23 micro –projects identified and are currently implemented (at least 100.000 beneficiaries direct and indirect).

- Stockpiling of emergency and relief items:

*Equipment were given to 14 local Committees,
2 Boat research and rescue purchase on-going for La Gonave.*

4000 family emergency kit will be providing in Martissant and la Gonâve and the process of selection of beneficiaries is on-going.



Key tools/procedures/initiatives

- Local disaster management

Committees and EIC (trainings, certificate, meetings, etc..)

- Institutional linkages and advocacy:

CWW Irish Aid Multi sectoral program Funding for la Gonâve & Saut D'eau.

-Information, education and communication:

*Special events, mass rally (carnival days, environment day) ,
DRR Schools competition (drawings, songs, sport game, poem, theatres, to communicate key DRR messages),
Awareness campaign (traffic Protection Civil, door to door, sound track, theatre-forum, Te male (risk land), banners, etc..), Community Forums
Materials and tools validated by DPC-CTESP*



Key tools/procedures/initiatives

- Small scale infrastructure and services:

VCA to identify the project , Pilot committee, Guidelines to select the mitigation project, Training in Project Mgt, Press and Media, Community meeting for project launching

- Stockpiling of emergency and relief items:

Equipment were provided to Committees

Mappings and poverty criteria were used to select beneficiaries for the family emergency kit distribution
